


SpringerLink

The instructions explain how to find information using the *SpringerLink* database, providing researchers with access to millions of scientific documents from journals, books, series, protocols and reference works.

FINDING THE DATABASE:

- Go to the Mack Library website.
- Click on "Online Resources" and then



- Click on "S" to jump directly to the databases beginning with S.
- Scroll down to *SpringerLink* and click on the title. Select "Medicine" from the column to the l
- SpringerLink
 Content: Full Text
 SpringerLink is an integrated full-text database for journals, books, protocols, eReferences, and book series published by Springer.
 SpringerLink currently offers 2,580 fully peer-reviewed journals and 43,690 books online.

- Removing the check from the Preview-Only box will limit the results to only full text chapters or articles.



- The default sort is Relevance, but can be changed to newest first or oldest first.



- SpringerLink has options for setting up a personal account.
- Downloading arrow allows the result list to open in an Excel file with links for each item up to 1000 items. If the link is requesting a Springerlink login, copy and paste the EZProxy info in front of the url to force authentication with the BJU server:
