These instructions explain how to find information using the *Bloom's Literature* database which features content from Facts On File's extensive print literature collection, hundreds of Harold Bloom's essays examining the lives and works of great writers throughout history and the world, and thousands of critical articles published by noted scholars under the Bloom's Literary Criticism imprint. This accessible database also contains an archive of more than 46,000 characters; extensive entries on literary topics, themes, movements, genres, and authors; more than 160 videos; and more.

- One can use the Browse feature on the home page to browse authors, works, videos.
- From the More drop box one can also choose Timeline, Movements, Themes, Bloom's Canon, and How to Write about.
- To save an article in the folder, create a folder when prompted after clicking on saved. The articles can be emailed. When print is selected, the article is reformatted to a printer friendly page.
- Citation tool takes one to the bottom of the article where the citation resides at the bottom.
